## CLUB CAPTAIN ANDREW LEINER

The sun is going down on another season at Kurrawa.

We came out of last season having had to deal with many Covid-19 related issues. The learnings from last season helped us this year to deal with this seasons Covid-19 spot fires. Besides the occasional community health issue this season, we saw a number of extremes in the prevailing weather conditions coupled with a continually changing beachscape.

We have had a large hole sitting in front of the club for most of the season and a combination of this hole, darkness, unfamiliarity, and extreme surf whipped up by some intense weather led to the unfortunate loss of 2 lives when the beach was unpatrolled in the evening. The committee and members of Kurrawa Surf Lifesaving Club send out their heartfelt condolences to the friends and families of the folks who lost their lives.

During the season, patrolling teams responded really well against the constant challenges which mother nature threw at them.

In total we have 206 patrolling members made up of 3 Life Members, 32 Long Service Members, 95 Active Seniors, 1 Reserve Active 41 Juniors, 33 SRCs and 1 Award Member. With 15 patrols, assisted by 9 cross over teams on the beach. 20/21, patrolling members completed over 7,700 hours with an average of 37.5 hours per member.

There were 4 members who had more than 100 patrol hours on our beach.

Kurrawa beach has seen more than 70,000 visitors during the 20/21 season.

We have had 47 rescues, remembering that the definition of a rescue is when a swimmer is assisted to the safety of dry land and required further assistance following the water-based rescue.

The rescues were broken down into 21 by tube, 14 by board, 8 by IRB and 4 with no gear.

We had 901 preventative actions during the season and 16 first aid incidents plus a further 15 minor first aid recorded in the incident logbook.

We had zero deaths between the flags on Kurrawa beach this season.

I'd like to make a very special mention of our CTO, Di Marchant, and her team, who started the season by conducting 67 ART, 237 Bronze, 142 Resus and 39 SRC proficiencies putting through almost 300 lifesavers. Subsequent to that The Training team has managed to put through 24 Bronze awards & 18 SRC awards. In addition, KSLSC hosted 31 first aid awards, 11 ART awards, 13 IRB crew person awards and 3 IRB driver award.

My thanks go out to all those members who put in the hard yards to make Kurrawa beach safe. I wish all patrolling members a relaxing off season and the best of luck to our champion IRB team.

## SURF SPORTS OFFICER SCOTT WHEELER

The 2020/2021 surf sports season was delayed in kicking off due to restrictions, lockdowns, and the uncertainty of the ever-evolving Covid-19 which was an emotional rollercoaster to say the least. SLSQ adjusted the season program for IRBs and Pool Rescue which allowed competition to occur in August and September 2020. Neither had their Australian Championships, luckily they did not miss out on an entire season.

Impressively, with less training and racing opportunities and smaller team numbers our IRB Team continued their reign and finished the season as the 2020/21 Queensland IRB Champions for the fourth year in a row!

Our Pool Rescue Team was headed by Coach, Stephanie Wilson and consisted mainly of our U11-U14 members. It was great to see lots of interest from our younger members continuing being involved in the Club throughout their nippers "off-season". Pool Rescue had just two events for their season, the Gold Coast competition, and the Queensland Championships. Our team finished 7th overall on 79 points at Queensland Championships which is a great result with only 16 competitors!

As the summer season kicked off, we had reduced competitor numbers but once again, our athletes showed up and gave their best at the carnivals coming home with some great results. Wes Gould and Tanyin Lyndon represented Kurrawa in the Nutri-Grain Iron Series which was a tough competition with 6 rounds split over two weekends. Wes finished up strong in 11th place overall and Tanyin 21st overall after bowing out of the final three rounds. We had strong group of U15 and U17s attend the Summer of Surf Series with our U17 Male Taplin Team finishing up 2nd overall and our Open Male Double ski team come in at 3rd place overall.

We had five surf boat crews racing for Kurrawa this season The Old Boys (260+), Stiff Brown Sauce (200+), Katanas (Open Male), Kahunas (Reserve Female) and Kastaways (U19 Female). Our standout crews this season were the Katanas and Kahunas who came away with multiple podium placings. The Kastaways were established late in the season and only had the opportunity to race together at States and Aussies however it is great to see a younger crew come together at Kurrawa and we look forward to seeing what they bring in 2021/2022.

Our Nipper coaching crew, Spoon, Bonnie, Mel and Simone had a lot of kids to train this year which was fantastic. This will affect the way we trade and possibly include continued social distancing and clear evidence of positive hygienic practices throughout our venue.

What has been said earlier clearly has a strong reference to COVID and whilst this is somewhat sombre, I can assure all members we are doing many things to the fullest and patronage continues to flourish. We have a good name in hospitality as judged by our peers and major awards achieved. Please support your club whenever possible so that your Supporters might reciprocate.

The Supporters Board wishes the Surf Club all the success it can garner, and we are pleased to play a major part to assist in the achievement of your goals.

## TREASURER ADAM PINE OAM, OLY

It is with pleasure that I present the Financial and Auditor's Reports of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc for the financial year ended 31 March 2021.

The financial report for the 2020-2021 year records an operating deficit of \$247,943 which includes a depreciation charge \$399,677. However, the Club achieved an operating cash surplus of \$177,607, refer to the Statement of Cash Flows on page 5. This compares to an operating deficit of \$10,049 for the 2019-2020 financial year, a year that operated without the impacts of COVID. The use of the Federal Government subsidies, JobKeeper and Cash Flow Boost, and the donations received from Kurrawa SLS Supporter's Association Inc allowed the Club to reopen and operate in reduced capacity in a very uncertain environment. General donations received from Supporters Club totaled \$150,000. In addition to this the Supporters Club donated \$447,815 to service the Building Loan.

The reconciled bank balance for the General account as of 31 March 2021 was \$25,301 with total available cash at 31 March being \$105,493, refer to Note 5 on page 13.

During the financial year like many businesses and individuals, the club took advantage of a COVID halt in servicing the business loans before resuming repayments. The combined loans were reduced from \$6,067,120 (2020) to \$5,555,308 (2021). In addition, an allocation of \$1,000,000 was made by the Supporters Club to be at call and reduce the loan liability.

As always, I would like to thank the Supporters Club Committee and staff for their hard work without which we would not afford the financial backing to operate as we do today. I would also like to thank all of our professional office staff whose support to the Board and Members has allowed a smooth operation in a turbulent year. In particular, I thank Karen Fleischer whose support and professionalism has greatly supported my role as Treasurer and always operates in the best interest of the club and our bottom line. Thank you Karen for your great service.

**NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Corporate Information**

The financial report is for Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld). The association is a charity registered under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth).

**Basis of Preparation**

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc applies Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards and AASB 2010–2: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements and other applicable Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB), the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld), the *Collections Act 1966* (Qld) and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth). The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

**Accounting Policies**

**a. Income Tax**

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

**b. Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

**c. Economic Dependence**

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

**d. Comparative Figures**

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

**e. Revenue**

**Revenue recognition**

*Contributed assets*

The association receives assets from the government and other parties for nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116, AASB 1058 and AASB 138).

On initial recognition of an asset, the association recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The association recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

*Capital grant*

Grant revenue received from government that relates to the purchase of capital assets is offset against the amount of the capital asset. The grant is recognised in profit or loss over the life of the depreciable asset as a reduced depreciation expense.

*Operating grants, donations and bequests*

When the association receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the association:

- > identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- > recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- > recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the association:

- > recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- > recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- > recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the association recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

*Interest income*

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

**f. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

The estimate of the useful life of plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered by the committee during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee members.

**g. Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The committee members found no indication that any asset had been impaired.

**h. Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less.

**i. Trade and Other Receivables**

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**j. Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

**k. Property, Plant and Equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

**Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment**

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1(g) for details of impairment).

**k. Property, Plant and Equipment (continued)**

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are classified as repairs and maintenance and are charged to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

**Depreciation**

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including leasehold improvements is depreciated on a straight line basis (prime rate) over their useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Leasehold Improvements	2.50% - 10.00%
Furniture and Fittings	6.66% - 40.00%
Gear and Equipment	5.00% - 25.00%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

**l. Trade and Other Payables**

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

**m. Employee Benefits**

**Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits**

All employees of the association receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the association pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 9.5% of the employee's average ordinary salary) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

**Short-term employee benefits**

Provision is made for the association's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The association's obligations for short-term employee benefits are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

**m. Employee Benefits (continued)**

**Long-term employee benefits**

The association only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the association's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The association's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as provisions under non-current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position, except where the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

**n. Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

**o. Leases**

**The association as lessee**

At inception of a contract, the association would assess if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the association where the association is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (i.e. a lease with a remaining lease term of twelve months or less), leases of low-value assets and concessionary (peppercorn) leases are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

**Concessionary leases**

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the association to further its objectives (also referred to as peppercorn leases), the association has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2018-8 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

The association is dependent on this lease to further its objectives. Without this concessionary lease, it would be unlikely for the association to provide surf life saving services.

**The association as lessor**

The association leases a portion of the building to the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc.

Rental income received from the operating lease is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

**p. Financial Instruments**

**Initial recognition and measurement**

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the association becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the association commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted). Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss" in which case transaction costs are recognised immediately as expenses in profit or loss.

##### Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, amortised cost using the effective interest method, or cost. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

#### Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial asset is derecognised.

#### Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities other than financial guarantees are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial liability is derecognised.

#### Impairment

At the end of each reporting period, the association assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset has been impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is deemed to be impaired if, and only if, there is objective evidence that impairment as a result of one or more events (a "loss event") has occurred, which has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset(s).

a. The association has a loan facility of up to \$8,500,000 with the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc to fund the new building and to assist in the repayment of the bank loans described above. The loan taken is non-recourse interest free loan which will be repaid as specified in the loan agreement. The loan has been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan.

b. The bank loans comprise of two loans, for \$6,000,000 and for \$2,000,000, both being principal and interest. The loan facilities expire on 27 February 2028. Accordingly, the principal and interest loans have been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan. Further, the association has \$817,603 available for redraw if required.

A loan covenant exists over the loans which requires the 'Debt Service Cover ratio of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc and the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc is at all times not less than 1.25 times where the Debt Service Cover = (EBITDA less tax divided by gross interest plus twelve months principal payments plus line fees). The loan covenant is reviewed on a monthly basis and no breach of the covenant has been identified during the financial year or to the date of this financial report.



# VALE - LESLIE JOHN BENSON

BRONZE NO. Q7261

Les Benson – known as Baldy – gained his Bronze medallion on 15 November 1970, he followed with other awards, Bronze Assessor, ARC and ARCI, CTO, Asst CTO and Branch Delegate.

In the 1974 floods on the Gold Coast a Kurrawa surf boat was used to rescue three men, a woman, two girls and an Alsation dog, Les was part of the crew (stroke). He was a great surfer and could read the surf extremely well, as part of a team he won a bronze medal at the Branch Titles in the Surf Teams event. Les also loved to paddle his ski.

With other members Les assisted in writing the original club song (it can be found written in the club history book). He also served as carnival team manager for several years.

At the Australian Championships held at Kurrawa in 1984 Les was in charge of Beverages, in later Aussies he was in charge of Crash Patrol, worked with Roger, the Event Coordinator and assisted as Gear Steward. Les famously started the Black Beer Day – this was a big social day when they travelled by bus starting at a hotel in Tweed Heads, they then called into every surf club that served Black Beer all the way up to Surfers Paradise and then back to Kurrawa, spreading good cheer along the way.

Les was honoured with Life Membership of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club in June 1994 for 23 years of 'over and above' service. An award he was very proud of.

More recently Les was in charge of the carnival tents – known as the 'Tent Fairy'; with a mate they would spread the tents out on the hill in front of the clubhouse (original club) wash down and then fold up and put them away ready for the next carnival. He also ran the club members Handicap Surf Swim each Sunday morning for three years.

Sadly Les suffered illness for a long time before finally succumbing and passing away, he was a true blue club member as well as a legend for his knowledge and excellent memory of Kurrawa Surf Club. He served his beloved club for 50 years. Condolences are conveyed to his family and many friends and may he forever Rest in Peace.

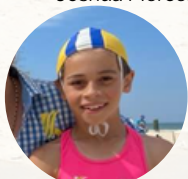
