1. INTRODUCTION

This document outlines some key information relating to SCB U11-U15 Championships - Water Carnival. Please note that SLSQ South Coast Branch may have subsequent bulletins or circulars which may supersede information provided in this circular.

It is important the information in this Circular is brought to the attention of all Carnival Officials, Team Managers, Coaches, Competitors and Family Members. Non receipt of the Circular will not be taken as an excuse if a Club, Team or Individual does not comply with the requirements outlined in this and subsequent Bulletins and Circulars.

All Clubs and Competitors are required to adhere to the conditions as outlined in this circular as they relate to entry fees, entry conditions, provision of water safety, officials and rescue craft.

The exact location of the event will be determined on the day pending environmental conditions.

2. KEY DATES

Entries are invited from all SCB clubs for the SCB U11-U15 Championships - Water Carnival. The method of entry is via the SEMS Entry System.

3. EVENT RULES

This event will be conducted in accordance with the current edition of the *SLSA Surf Sports Manual*. The current Edition SSM (37th as at June 2022) can be accessed from the SLSA Publications App (available via the Apple or Android App Stores) or from within the Members Portal DOCUMENT area of the SLSA Website: https://members.sls.com.au/SLSA_Online/modules/login/index.php

4. COMPETITION COMMITTEE

The Competition Committee (CC) will direct all matters relating to the delivery of the event and conduct of the competition. The CC may, in accordance with the rules in the current edition of the *SLSA Surf Sports Manual*, any subsequent amending bulletins and this circular, postpone, cancel and/or alter any or all events, and/or the venue of the competition.

The CC may consult and seek advice from appropriate patrol members, officials, athletes and other personnel as they deem necessary on competition conditions and safety issues when required. The CC shall appoint the various sub-committees and panels as required for the event e.g. Disciplinary Committee & Coach/Athlete Panel.

5. SAFETY & EMERGENCY COMMITTEE

A Safety and Emergency Committee (SEC) shall be appointed which must consider and advise the Competition Committee on all matters relating to competition and non-competition safety and emergency services. The Chair of the SEC shall be the Safety and Emergency Coordinator who shall also be a member of the Competition Committee. The composition of the SEC will be determined by SLSQ South Coast Branch.

6. ENTRY FEES

~ \$40 incl. GST per competitor regardless of the number of events across both SCB U11-U15 Championships Carnivals - Water and Beach

No late entries will be accepted.

A tax invoice for all club entries will be issued to clubs in the week after the event.

7. ENTRY CONDITIONS

All competitors, officials, water safety, first aid, IRB and team management personnel must be registered and financial members of their Surf Life Saving Club for the 2022/23 season.

All members over 18 who hold any official capacity at this carnival (voluntary or paid) on behalf of the South Coast Branch or their own club must;

- ~ Hold a Working with Children Blue Card (as per the SLSQ Blue Card Screening Policy)
- ~ Have completed the SLSQ Child Youth Risk Management Strategy
- ~ Have completed the SLSA Safeguarding Children and Young People Course

Clubs are required to provide Officials, Water Safety personnel, First Aid and IRB boats/drivers/crews on a roster basis reflecting the ratio of Club athlete nominations. Requirements are outlined in this Entry Circular. Rosters and Final Carnival Bulletin will be distributed on the Wednesday ahead of the Carnival, conditional upon ALL information being received from Clubs within the designated timelines.

CLUBS NOT SUPPLYING THE PRE-REQUISITE NUMBER OF OFFICIALS, IRB DRIVER/CREW AND ORANGE SHIRT WATER SAFETY MAY BE DENIED A START AT THE CARNIVAL.

As per the SLSA SSM, members can compete in individual and team events for their own age category and in team events in the next older age category providing they have met all necessary pre-requisites. Members **may make up the full complement of a team** in an older age category however events will not be held up for competitors coming from other arenas/races.

If a competitor is already entered in events on the carnival program and wishes to enter into another event on the day, this can be done with Carnival Administration prior to the start of the carnival and with the Marshall on the beach relevant to each Arena.

The following **Cancellation fee** and **Refund Policy** will be adhered to:

- ~ If a carnival is cancelled, with no postponement before the first event is conducted, 75% of all entry fees will be refunded to all clubs and/or individuals (25% retained for administration costs), whichever party paid the original fee.
- ~ If a carnival is cancelled, after the first event is conducted, no refund will be given.
- ~ If a carnival is postponed and rescheduled to another date, a 75% refund will be issued to competing clubs that cannot compete at the re-scheduled event.

8. ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

- ~ All competitors must be registered & financial members of their Surf Life Saving Club for the 2022/23 season.
- ~ All competitors must be competent/proficient in the following relevant to their current age group:
 - o U11-U13 Age Award (Form 14 must be submitted to SLSQ for processing by 25th January)
 - o U14-U15 Surf Rescue Certificate

11. LIVE HEATS

The carnival will be supported by LiveHeats, a paperless marshalling and recording system. ALL Competitors will be required to wear a wristband for the duration of the event. Wristbands will be distributed free of charge ONCE this season. Following this, all competitors will be required to purchase a new wristband.

LiveHeats can be accessed via the web at [LiveHeats | Live Scoring and Competition Management Platform for Sports](#). The carnival is called SCB U11-U15 Championships - Water.

Competitors are required to attend marshalling knowing their draw number. Subsequent rounds will be randomly drawn using LiveHeats and available to members on the LiveHeats soon after the completion of the last race in that round. A live point score will also be available on LiveHeats.

Competitors are requested to bring their Live Heats wristbands. They will be available from 6:45am at Administration to purchase for \$5 CASH if competitors have received them before.

12. MEDALS, PRESENTATIONS and SCORING

Medallists from each event in each age group will receive event medals progressively throughout the event.

Club point scores will be determined on a 6 points for 1st down to 1 point for 6th place system across all events. An Overall Points Score will be calculated throughout the carnival and available on LiveHeats.

13. TEAM MANAGERS

Dress Clubs are allowed one (1) Team Manager and one (1) Assistant Team Manager to assist in the team organisation. These members should be clearly identifiable by their labelled clothing item or lanyard. Team Managers and Age Managers will be required to wear a lanyard containing their Bluecard and a form of Identification, e.g. Driver Licence, Proof of Age card, Medicare card.

Declarations No clubs will be eligible to compete in the Carnival without a completed Team Manager's Declaration. Team Managers must have a current Blue Card that is displayed and have completed both CYRMS and Child Safe online courses. All relevant Carnival information will be distributed to Team Managers in the event of Carnival relocation or Cancellation.

Changes Any changes of Team/Age Manager personnel must be reported to Carnival Administration and a current blue card must be produced.

14. OFFICIALS

All clubs must provide officials at the required ratio of one (1) accredited official per 10 competitors (Probationary Officials are not included in this ratio). Clubs that do not supply enough officials will be excluded from competing. IRB Driver and Crew for water safety do not count as officials (unless they hold the Officials Accreditation and are acting as a Judge in Boat).

Please ensure all Officials attend the Official's meeting and sign in. If there are insufficient Officials the carnival may be modified or shortened at the Carnival Referee's discretion. If a nominated official does not attend, Clubs must replace them with another qualified member. Official Nominations are required by Monday 23rd January via:

15. IRBs

Two IRB Duty Boats with Driver and Crew will be provided by South Coast Branch following an EOI process. These crews will be responsible for setting and packing up of the arenas as well as moving cans during competition.

Each water arena will require two IRBs with Driver and Crew. The Duty Boats will contribute to required craft.

The top 6 (six) South Coast Branch clubs, based on competitor numbers will provide 1 x fully serviced and operational IRB, Driver and Crew. Based on 2021/22 carnival, these clubs may be: North Burleigh, BHMP, Mermaid, Kurrawa, Northcliffe, Southport.

All personnel will be required to SIGN ON and OFF to comply with workplace safety and insurance purposes. Failure by a club to provide IRB and Water Safety personnel as per roster will exclude that club from competing.

All IRB Drivers and Crew must be proficient and have their own PFD and high vis. If any Driver/Crew does not have their own approved PFD, the club concerned will be suspended from the Carnival until said equipment is available. (Refer SLSQ PFD Policy).

All IRBs shall be inspected by the Carnival IRB Coordinator and if found to be unserviceable will be rejected and the club shall provide a replacement. Club competitors may be held until replacement arrives. The fully kitted out and functioning IRB will need to be available at the host club by 06:30. Failure of clubs to provide the boat on time will result in all Competitors from that club being withdrawn from the Carnival.

Clubs that are supplying IRBs are permitted to rotate their IRB Driver and Crews at their own discretion.

All IRB Duty Boats, IRB Driver and Crew personnel are to be nominated by Monday 23rd January via: [IRB Nominations](#)

16. WATER SAFETY

All clubs will be required to provide proficient and capable water safety for the duration of the carnival based on competitor numbers. Water safety requirements will be split into shifts and clubs may rotate their water safety personnel at their own discretion as long as safety is maintained. All personnel will be required to SIGN ON and OFF to comply with workplace safety and insurance purposes. Water Safety Personnel must arrive with SLSA approved water safety high vis orange rashie/shirt, orange cap and rescue tube. WS personnel must be proficient SRC or Bronze Medallion holders.

Failure by a club to provide IRB and Water Safety personnel as per roster will exclude that club from competing. Any club whose Water Safety disappears during the day will be suspended from that event until their Water Safety returns

Once entries close, SCB will allocate set numbers to each club depending on total Competitor numbers. This information will be contained in the Final Carnival Bulletin. Each water arena will require a minimum of four (4) water safety personnel at all times.

17. FIRST AID

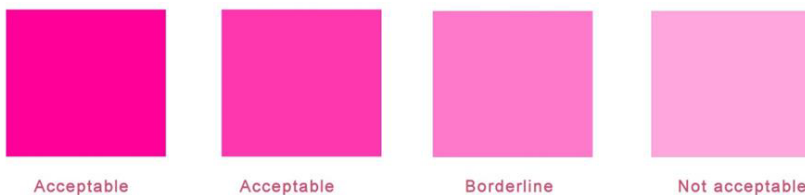
The same procedures apply for the supply of First Aid personnel as for Water Safety. All first aid personnel will be required to be nominated by Monday 23rd January via: [First Aid Nominations](#)

18. DRESS OF COMPETITORS

Club competition caps MUST be worn in all races to assist with identification of athletes. SLSQ Policy MS13 (1 July 2017) will be implemented requiring all competitors in ocean or open water-based surf life saving events held in Queensland to wear high visibility lycra/rash top/singlet. If the competitor's rash top does not meet the standards, they will be asked to find another rash top, or the race will commence with out them. In reference to swimwear please refer to SLSA's Bulletin August 2009 (Document ID # 3/09-10) in reference to "Review of SLSA Swimsuit Standards".

Costumes, Dress and Style must be of the correct specification according to SLSA policy 2.5.1 and will be monitored. A competitor shall not be permitted to take part in any competition if, in the opinion of the Referee, the competitor is not properly dressed.

To promote competitor safety and assist with competitor identification, competitors and handlers are required to wear approved hi-vis clothing as their top layer of clothing as well as a Club competition cap.



19. PROTESTS and APPEALS

Only the Team Manager is permitted to discuss protests with the Sectional Referees or Competitor Liaison Officer. A protest must be lodged verbally with the Sectional Referee or Competitor Liaison Officer within 5 minutes of the completion of the event. A written protest in accordance with the current edition of the SLSA SSM must then be lodged within 15 minutes of the verbal protest being lodged on the protest form provided by the Authority. Protest Forms are available at Carnival Administration or the Competitor Liaison Officer.

Clubs may appeal dismissed protests to the Appeals Committee and lodge a fee of \$110.00 per appeal. If the appeal is upheld the fee is returned – if the appeal is dismissed the fee is retained by Branch.

20. INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR

Inappropriate behaviour between and/or towards, but not limited to, administration, officials, coaches, competitors, volunteers, parents, spectators or community members during the course of this event will be referred to the Carnival Committee. If further action is required it will then proceed to the South Coast Branch Judiciary. Any concerns should be raised by Team Managers to the Sectional and/or Carnival Referee in the first instance. Clubs are asked to remind all members of the intent of Play by the Rules as per this Circular.

Any misconduct while at the event will not be tolerated. This includes the days leading into the competition and any official social activities following the conclusion of the event. Offending members risk disciplinary action against both themselves and their Clubs.

Please refer to the current edition of the SLSA Surf Sport's Manual, Section 2.27 SLSA Code of Behaviour and 2.28 Abuse / Inappropriate Behaviour and the Policy 6.5 Member Protection Policy (available online at the Member's Portal).

21. COVID Safe

SLSQ South Coast Branch have put together plans to ensure all carnivals are hosted safely. The event will be conducted in line with Queensland Health advice on the day of the carnival. Above all else we ask that members follow safe hygiene practices and maintain 1.5m between people at all times.

SLSQ South Coast Branch highly recommends that anyone attending an event has the recommended COVID-19 vaccinations and boosters.

23. GENERAL INFORMATION

Anti-doping

SCB, SLSQ and SLSA supports the Australian Government, the Australian Sport's Commission, the Australian Olympic Committee, and the Sport Integrity Australia in their efforts to eradicate the use of drugs in sport.

It is strongly recommended that all Coaches and Team Managers complete the Sport Integrity Australia Anti-Doping Fundamentals Course (formerly Level 1) as well as the Australian Government's Competition Manipulation and Sport's Betting Course (formerly Match Fixing). Both of these courses are free of charge and provide an opportunity to develop a knowledge and understanding of anti-doping and match fixing in sport. Care in the Sun

It is highly recommended that all athletes ensure they carry with them adequate apparel (Personnel Protective Equipment/clothing) to assist with reduction of sunburn, along with recommended use of sunscreen, prior to reporting for Marshalling.

It is strongly recommended that all competitors in Beach Events (Beach Sprint, Beach Relays and Beach Flags) wear long sleeve rashies or equivalent long sleeve protection garments. This means the entire upper torso be covered including arms, shoulders, chest, stomach and back.

Club tents

Tents can be erected on the day of the carnival in conjunction with the host club workforce and the Carnival referee. Marshalling and competitor shade tents only will be allowed on the beach within the competition area.

Should a club erect a tent without the direction of the host club workforce or carnival personnel they may be asked to remove this at a later time.

Clubs are to ensure that all tents are pegged or weighted.

Entry to Arenas

Entry to arenas will be limited to Competitors, Officials, rostered Water Safety, IRB Drivers and Crew, First Aid and Team Managers. TM are requested to assist settle competitors in marshalling and then leave the arena.

Health and Wellbeing

The welfare of all competitors and officials is of paramount importance. Athletes, or their parent/guardian in the case of underage competitors, should seek advice prior to the competition from a qualified professional for any health concerns if required.

Any competitor or official who suffers illness or injury prior to or at the event must seek a medical clearance before resuming their normal activities which includes training and competition.

In addition, SLSQ South Coast Branch may, at its sole discretion, require a competitor and/or official to be assessed for physical and/or psychological fitness to participate in the competition. This ensures the safety and wellbeing of the athlete concerned and fellow competitors while also ensuring all parties and SLSQ SCB are not placed at risk.

Hydration

Water Barrels will be available under the Marshalling tents for Officials, Team Managers and athletes use. There will however, be no cups supplied. These barrels are in place for all persons to use and fill up their own water bottles or drinking utensils.

Parking

Gold Coast City Council Parking Officers and Queensland Police Officers will be patrolling the area and parking fines will be issued if cars are parked in illegal areas. Parking on nature strips, area of open space and parkland are not permitted. Clubs and Competitors are asked to take due care when parking. No liability will be accepted by the Branch or host venue for illegal parking.

No Carnival personnel are permitted at any time to park within the car parks of any businesses or in non-designated parking areas. Any cars that belong to life saving will be towed at the owner's expense.

Photography

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Only people with an SLSQ Photographer Pass will be permitted to take photos at this event. Club Photographers MUST have their Club Photographer pass on display at all times so that Officials can clearly see the pass. Club Photographers are to ensure they do not in any way interfere with competitors or competition. Members of the public are permitted to take photos from behind the barriers, the grandstands and other publicly accessible areas. Spectators who become concerned about the behaviour of photographers in publicly accessible areas are asked to contact Sectional or Carnival Referees or the Carnival Administration area.

PHOTOGRAPHY: As a condition of entry, all competitors agree to have photos and video taken during the event used for promotional material by SLSQ South Coast Branch.

DRONES: For the safety of competitors, officials and spectators SLSQ prohibits the use of drones or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) at this event by members and/or public unless approved by SLSQ 7 days prior to the event. The operator must supply an operation's manual (including risk management plan), provide a copy of public liability insurance and comply with all Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) requirements. SLSQ may utilize the use of its own drones to conduct aerial surveillance and monitor hazards.

Rubbish

Please coordinate club members to clean up their rubbish in the area immediately around your club tent. Consider bringing extra garbage bags to hang on your tent to encourage members to put their rubbish directly into the bins.

Security

Please note security is not provided for this carnival. All property left at the carnival is at the owner's risk, be that individual or Club.

Trailers

Please take note of all GC City Council parking signs. All trailers are to be left in the trailer drop off area. For assistance with transporting equipment onto the beach please meet the host club workforce at the beach access point (located on the above Map). Under no circumstances are unauthorized vehicles to take trailers onto beach.

Gold Coast City Council will be undertaking periodical checks throughout the weekend and booking all vehicles illegally parked, hefty fines will be enforced for any vehicle parked illegally.

NO PERSONAL 4WD ARE PERMITTED ON THE BEACH AT ANY TIME. IF ANY CLUB/PERSON IS FOUND DOING THIS THEN THE ENTIRE TEAM WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Warm Up Areas

All clubs must supply their own water safety personnel (correct ratio 1:5) for warm up sessions before the commencement of the day's events. No competitors are to enter the water until officials provide confirmation that all water safety has signed on. All competitors are to wear pink high vis and club cap during warm up. Water safety personnel are to wear orange shirts and cap. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action which will affect the club's involvement at the Carnival.

To ensure the safety of all water safety and competitors, Clubs are reminded that there are specific times for warm up. Swim and Craft Warm up (across all areas) will be subject to the notification from the IRB coordinator on the day. No competitors are to go within 30m of the cans prior to the commencement of competition.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR MEMBERS

Members and all people involved in any way with SLS will:

- a) Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others—treat others as you would like to be treated yourself
- b) Be ethical, considerate, fair, courteous and honest in all dealings with other people and organisations
- c) Be professional in, and accept responsibility for your actions
- d) Be aware of and follow—at all times—SLS’ standards, rules, policies and procedures and promote those standards, rules, policies and procedures to others
- e) Operate within the rules and spirit of the sport, including the national and international guidelines that govern SLS
- f) Understand the possible consequences of breaching the codes and/or this policy
- g) Report any breaches of the codes or this policy to the appropriate PPA
- h) Refrain from any form of abuse, harassment, discrimination and victimisation towards others
- i) Raise concerns regarding decisions of PPA through the appropriate channels and in a timely manner
- j) Provide a safe environment for the conduct of activities in accordance with any relevant SLSA policy
- k) Show concern, empathy and caution towards others that may be sick or injured
- l) Be a positive role model to all
- m) Respect and protect confidential information obtained through SLS activities or services; whether individuals and/or organisational information
- n) Maintain the required standard of accreditation and/or licensing of professional competencies, as applicable to the role(s)
- o) Ensure that any physical contact with others is appropriate to the situation and necessary for the person’s skill development
- p) Refrain from intimate relations with persons over whom you have a position of authority
- q) Agree to abide by the codes
- r) Maintain a duty of care towards others
- s) Be impartial and accept the responsibility for all actions taken

Person in Position of Authority (PPA):

PPA include everyone who holds a position of authority in SLS, whether paid or unpaid, and includes, but is not limited to, all SLS Entity Individual Members. For the avoidance of doubt, PPA also includes Child or Young Person (CYP) who may hold a position of authority in SLS over other CYP.
