As another patrol season concludes, it is with great pride and gratitude that I reflect on the incredible service delivered by the patrolling members of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club. This season once again demonstrated the professionalism, dedication, and unwavering community spirit that defines our Club.

The 2024/2025 seasons started with Kurrawa SLSC hosting the Lifesaving World Championships. What an event, what an opportunity to showcase the club. To everyone who stood up and helped in every way – too many to name – thank you. It was a wonderful event and we all came together to get the job done.

Our 165 patrolling members formed 13 patrol groups, completing an impressive 7,500 hours of volunteer service on Kurrawa Beach. Everyone's vigilance and commitment ensured public safety across the entire patrol season. I'm incredibly proud to report that our teams carried out 33 significant rescues from between the red and yellow flags and responded to 145 minor and 23 major first aid incidents, including 20 searches for lost children. These figures highlight the vital role we play in keeping our community safe and our beach incident-free.

Special acknowledgement goes to the 42 members who exceeded 50 patrol hours this season, with particular praise to Chris, Mandy, and who both surpassed 100 hours—a testament to their dedication.

Our training and education teams, led by our exceptional Trainers and Assessors, ensured our members remained rescue-ready. A total of 230 Bronze Medallion proficiencies were completed, alongside 105 IRB Crew and 68 IRB Driver proficiencies. Their commitment to building capability and confidence in our patrol teams is instrumental to the success of our lifesaving services. We also welcomed 17 new Bronze Medallion members and 12 Surf Rescue Certificate awardees and 6 new IRB drivers and crew.

Additionally, 562 hours of voluntary water safety were provided across Club activities and 1177 volunteer hours to other organisations and operational support—highlighting our holistic approach to safety, both during and outside formal patrol hours.

None of this would be possible without the structured support of our leadership. A heartfelt thank you to our Patrol Captains, who set the tone each patrol day with professionalism and purpose. Their leadership ensures our beach remains safe, cohesive, and welcoming.

I also extend sincere thanks to the Old Boys, who turn up every Monday morning to clean and maintain our patrol trailers, IRBs and lifesaving gear. Their behind-the-scenes work ensures our equipment is always in top condition.

To our Admin team—Simone and Maddy—thank you for your consistent professionalism, communication, and logistical support throughout the season. Your work keeps the engine room of the Club humming. Special thanks also go to Rob Pollock—your tireless coordination, attention to detail, and knowledge are invaluable to everything lifesaving.

Thank you to the Kurrawa Board of Management for maintaining lifesaving as the Club's core business. Your continued prioritisation of safety, service and member development is critical to the Club's ongoing success.

To our Surf Sports and Junior Activities teams – congratulations on another successful season. Your contribution to building community, confidence and camaraderie cannot be overstated. To every patrolling member—THANK YOU. You wear the red and yellow with pride, and through your efforts we've once again ensured that there were zero preventable deaths on Kurrawa Beach.

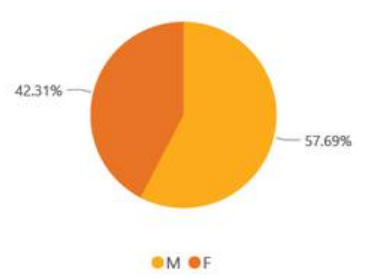
Post-Rescue Condition



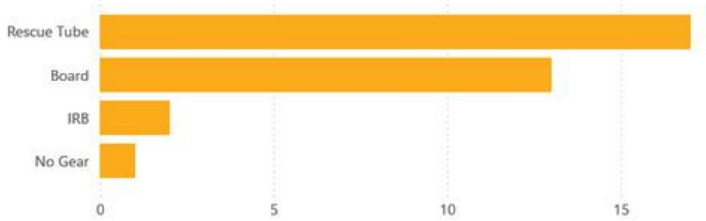

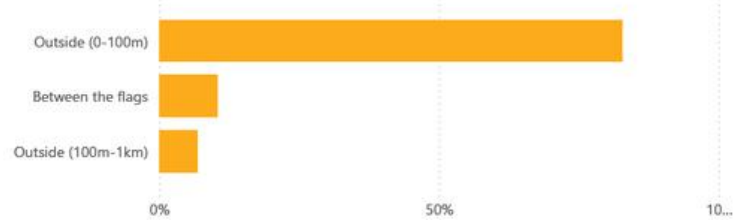

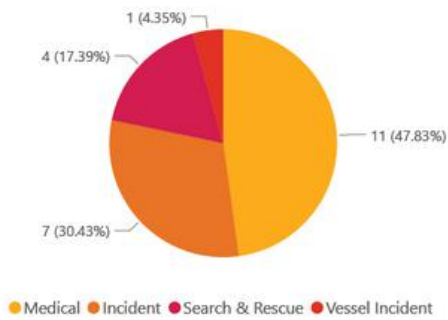
Rescue Method

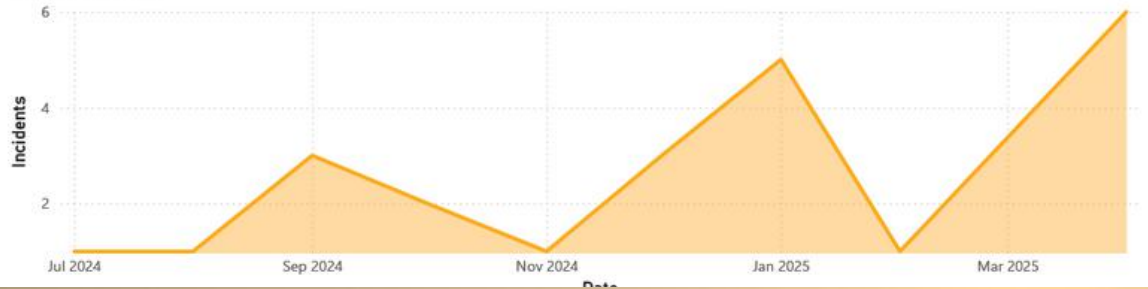

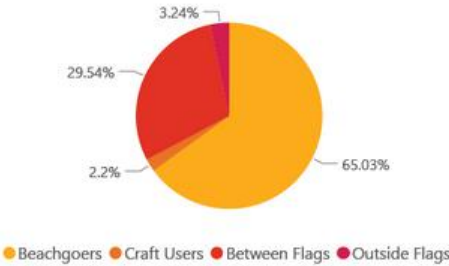

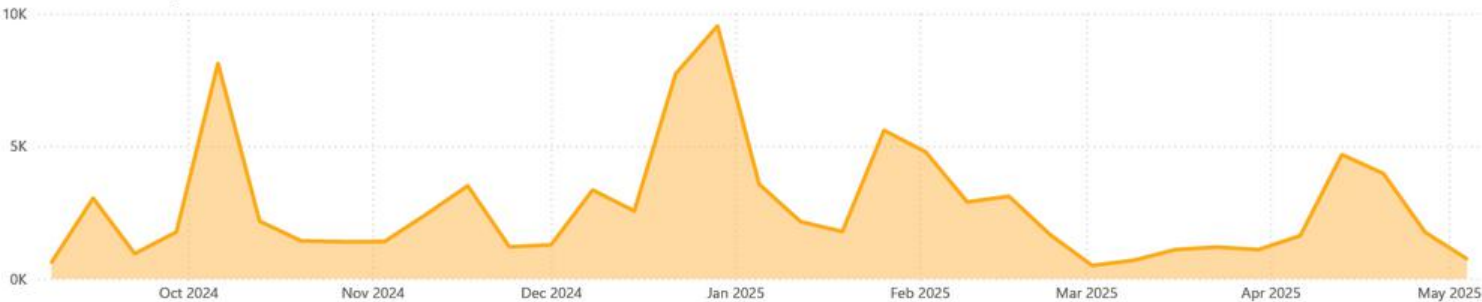

The 2024/2025 season was one of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club's most memorable yet, marked by remarkable performances across all disciplines, dedicated teamwork, and the shared spirit of success.

Our IRB team led from the front in 2024, displaying exceptional skill and consistency. Competing in the 2024 IRB Championships across the Open, U23 and masters categories, they brought home a total of 4 gold, 3 silver, and 3 bronze medals, earning 2nd overall in the U23s, 3rd in Opens, and 6th in Masters. Their efforts in the 2024 Sharkskin IRB Series were equally impressive, finishing 3rd in U23, 2nd in both Masters and Opens, and 2nd overall on the series point score – a true testament to their class and camaraderie.

As the pool rescue season rolled around, our athletes transitioned seamlessly under the guidance of Kaia Sugars, who stepped into the coaching role for the first time this year. Her leadership helped steer the team to 7 gold, 8 silver, and 11 bronze medals, along with 9 top-6 finishes and a string of personal bests, reflecting strong development and dedication within the squad.

A buzz of excitement surrounded the club as we hosted the 2024 Lifesaving World Championships at Kurrawa Beach – a stunning showcase of our coastline and community. The weather was kind, and the setting could not have been more perfect. With expert coordination from Simone van Eck and the incredible Yellow Workforce, the event was a resounding success. A special thanks goes to the Old Boys, who once again took the lead in preparing meals for Officials with their trademark generosity and spirit.

Our athletes rose to the occasion, particularly in the Masters division, where Kurrawa competitors earned an extraordinary 21 gold, 23 silver, and 14 bronze medals. Notable contributors included Haruka Nakamura, Hiroko Kono, Miranda Goodwin, Craig Chapman, Karen Fischer, Helena Gordon, Katie Watts, Odette Blacklock, Michelle Jeffress, and Mike Tomblin, who featured heavily across the podium.

In the Open World Championships, the standout performance came from the women's beach relay team, who powered to a gold medal, while Jackson Collins earned a silver medal in his event. The team also secured 16 top-20 finishes, showcasing depth and strength across the board.

Our Youth team, though small in number, made a big impact. They proudly secured 1 silver, 1 bronze, and 7 additional top-12 finishes, displaying determination and potential well beyond their years.

On the world stage of IRBs, our team delivered once again, finishing 2nd overall on the international point score, collecting silver and bronze medals, and achieving 13 top-15 placings, affirming Kurrawa's reputation as a global leader in IRB competition.

At the 2025 Australian Lifesaving Championships, our Masters athletes continued their dominance with 11 gold, 11 silver, and 9 bronze medals, plus 32 top-17 finishes. In the Opens division, Samuel McAuliffe claimed gold in the 2km beach run, and Jackson Collins added another gold in the Open Single Ski. Madeleine Newton earned silver in surfboard riding, while Alex Shepherd picked up bronze in the U17 2km beach run and teamed up with Will Mullen for another bronze in the U17 Male 2x1km beach relay. Across all events, our Open athletes achieved 35 top-20 finishes, a remarkable feat at such a competitive level.

In the Youth division at Aussies, Jessica Newton proudly secured a bronze medal in U15 surfboard riding. The entire Youth team made significant strides, delivering numerous personal bests in what was, for many, their first experience at the Australian Championships.

The Surf Boat section of the club also had a strong showing this season. Our legendary Old Boys crew competed in most local carnivals in the Over 200 Years category. At the Australian Open Championships in Coffs Harbour, they brought home a bronze medal. At Aussies, they made the final in challenging surf but suffered an unlucky collision in their last race, narrowly missing the podium despite a courageous effort.

The Kurrawa Kowgirls, led by Sweep Peter Mackie, showed remarkable adaptability, competing across both the U23 and Reserve Women's divisions depending on availability. Their commitment to training and growth translated into strong performances and clear development from all crew members.

Our junior development crew, the Kurrawa Kikis, were full of enthusiasm. Also swept by Peter Mackie, this young group – Ella Wheeler, Emma Cuthbertson, Georgia Hart, and Siana Duncan – took part in a six-week Surf Boat Challenge before heading to Noosa Heads for their first carnival road trip. Their energy, determination, and growth throughout the season were inspiring. We can't wait to see them back in the boat in 2025!

The KSLSC competitor section had to navigate through some unsettled waters earlier in the season following the resignation of our Head Coach. Under the stewardship of Shayne, the coaching staff were able to consolidate and lead the Kurrawa SLSC team into the 2024/2025 Australian titles. Kurrawa SLSC now looks forward to the newly appointed head coach, Kevin Morrison, joining the team.

These sections have been well supported by the Kurrawa SLSC office staff who have ensured that members are both organised and well informed in order to enjoy their membership at the club.

The Nipper and Youth section of the club have excelled in their respective areas which gives me the confidence that the senior ranks of Kurrawa SLSC will have an exciting future. A special call out for Simone and Ollie Van Eck who tirelessly support our youth members.

On the flip side, the Old Boys have also supported the Club and its members in such a way that it can only put a smile on your face and make you proud to say that you are a member of the Kurrawa SLSC.

Lastly, a big thankyou to the team in the Supporters Club. From the team members who pour the beer at the end of the day to the Supporters Board Members who provide the funds to allow all the members of Kurrawa SLSC to enjoy doing what they love best at the club.

What has impressed me the most this past season was the number of initiatives that have been enacted in the Club by a huge cross section of membership for the benefit of all members.

- Subsidised Kurrawa SLSC patrol jackets
- Subsidised Kurrawa SLSC Competitors uniforms
- Weekday access for mobility chairs to allow those with mobility issues to get to the waters edge
- Two of our Lifesaving members given the opportunity to attend the State Lifesaving Conference at Port Douglas
- Kurrawa SLSC branded t-shirts for new patrol starters subsidised by the Supporters Club
- Team bonding event at the Currumbin Sanctuary for Kurrawa SLSC Cadets; and
- Kurrawa SLSC Youth Development Camp

Next season my wish is that our Club membership and Supporters staff will continue to work closely together to make Kurrawa SLSC the Ace of Clubs.



Chief Training Officer



2024/2025 was another successful season for Kurrawa in the area of Training and Education.

We are fortunate to have an exceptionally qualified team of trainers and facilitators, allowing Kurrawa to operate independently within our education system. This autonomy eliminates the need for external assistance with courses and, combined with our Bronze/SRC trainers and content experts, places Kurrawa in a strong position to upskill both new and existing members.

Kurrawa currently has 12 trainers, 5 assessors, and 4 facilitators - a solid foundation to meet the training and education needs of a club of our size.

These members, along with a dedicated team of volunteers who support skills maintenance, ensure our members are able to demonstrate their proficiency without the process becoming unnecessarily lengthy. Over the season, we processed proficiencies for 230 Bronze members, 42 SRC, 104 IRB Crew, 68 IRB Drivers, and 96 ART. A huge thank you to everyone involved - we could not deliver this program without your continued support and commitment.

A key addition to our training resources this season was the purchase of three Brayden resuscitation manikins. These manikins provide real-time feedback, allowing candidates to monitor the effectiveness of their CPR technique. When correct depth and compression rate are achieved, the manikins light up the arteries and brain, providing a clear visual indicator of performance. We have budgeted for an additional two manikins to further enhance training in the coming season.

The table below outlines the courses delivered this season. While Bronze and SRC numbers have declined compared to previous years, this trend is consistent with broader challenges across lifesaving and similar organisations in attracting new members. The majority of Bronze/SRC award recipients continue to come from within our own ranks - particularly from nippers or those with backgrounds in international lifesaving organisations.

Once again, my sincere thanks go to our facilitators, assessors, trainers, content experts, IRB drivers, and water safety volunteers. Your ongoing support is invaluable, and without it, we would simply not be able to deliver the high standard of training and education Kurrawa is known for.

First Aid Officer



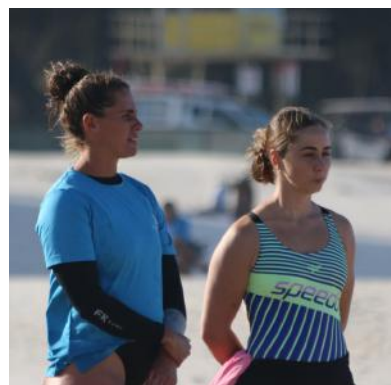
Kurrawa is in a strong position when it comes to emergency care. During the 2024/2025 season, 53 members gained their First Aid award, bringing the total number of members holding a current First Aid qualification to 145.

We currently have 57 members who hold the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) award. While there's still room for growth in this area, it's a solid number for our club. Members who already hold a current First Aid qualification are strongly encouraged to consider completing their ART. These awards can now be achieved through branch-run workshops or in collaboration with other clubs.

Recent changes to the education system, including the introduction of the aXcelerate learning platform, have streamlined both the ART and First Aid courses. All theory components are now completed online before attending the practical sessions, significantly reducing time spent in the classroom.

Throughout the 2024/2025 patrol season, Kurrawa attended 145 minor first aid incidents and 23 major incidents requiring external emergency services. Suspected spinal injuries were among the most serious, but thanks to the professional duty of care provided by our volunteer lifesavers, more serious outcomes were prevented.

It is important to remember that First Aid isn't limited to our lifesaving duties - having the ability to deliver first response emergency care is a valuable skill that can make a real difference in someone's life.

Youth Development Officer

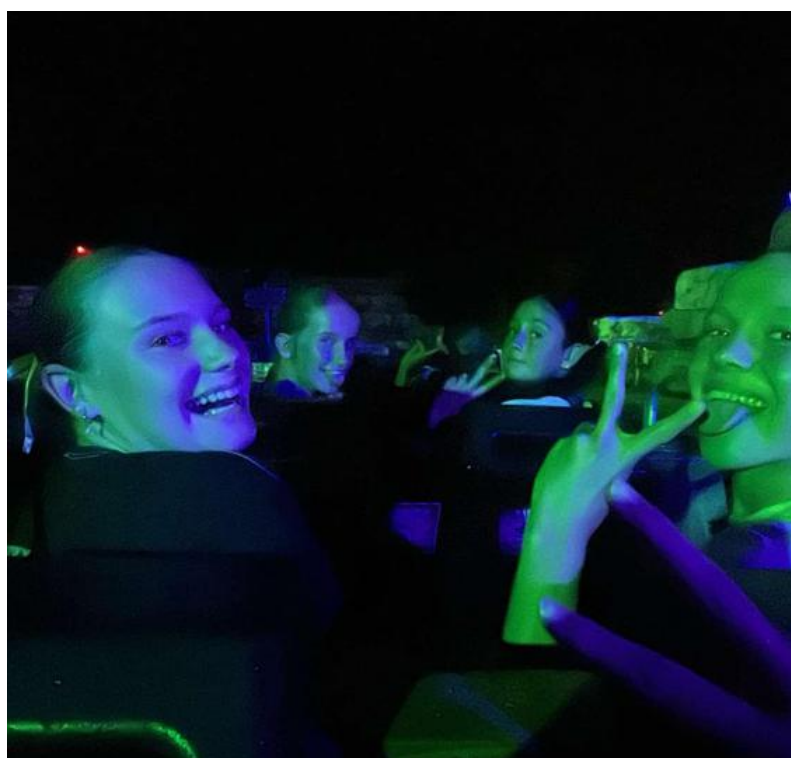


This year, the Kurrawa Cadet Program continued to focus on providing a variety of experiences that support the personal and social development of our youth members. The core aim of the program is to keep cadets engaged with the club during the period between nippers and patrolling, while helping them build the skills and confidence needed to transition into active roles within surf lifesaving. One of the key events on the calendar was the Kurrawa Youth Camp. This camp was designed to give cadets an opportunity to connect with each other outside of regular club activities, strengthen their sense of belonging to the Kurrawa community, and participate in a range of team-based challenges. The structure of the camp focused on teamwork, communication, and leadership, with informal sessions and shared responsibilities encouraging cadets to work together, reflect on their own contributions, and support their peers.

In addition to the camp, several external activities were offered throughout the year as part of the wider cadet calendar. These were planned to provide cadets with opportunities for social connection, exposure to new environments, and personal growth beyond the beach setting. The activities were selected with the goal of helping cadets build resilience, work together in unfamiliar situations, and experience different types of physical and mental challenges. Importantly, these events also helped keep cadets engaged during periods of the year when formal lifesaving commitments are lower. The activities were made financially accessible thanks to the generous support of the Kurrawa Board of Management and the Old Boys, who subsidised part of the cost for participants. The Kurrawa Nipper Club also played a key role in promoting the activities to families, ensuring strong participation and interest from within our youth community.

These opportunities contribute significantly to the ongoing success of the cadet program by helping young members stay connected to the club during a time when many begin to explore other interests. They also give youth leaders and program coordinators a chance to observe group dynamics and provide informal mentoring and support. By maintaining strong engagement through a mix of structured and social events, the program supports cadets in continuing their involvement with Kurrawa and preparing them for future roles in patrol teams, competition, and leadership. Across all activities, the focus remained on inclusion, participation, and personal growth. Rather than prioritising high performance or competition, the aim was to create a safe and positive space for cadets to build confidence, form lasting friendships, and feel a sense of value within the club.

Looking ahead, the cadet program will continue to evolve with input from youth members, families, and club leadership. The balance of beach-based training, social events, and personal development opportunities remains central to our approach. With continued support from the Kurrawa community, the program is well positioned to keep producing confident, community-minded young lifesavers with a strong connection to their club and their peers.



Old Boys Chairman



The major project for the Old Boys this year was providing Workforce for the 2024 Lifesaving World Championships held at Kurrawa over three weeks from 23rd August 2024. For many of the Kurrawa Old Boys Volunteers this meant 4.30am starts to provide meals for the Officials, WLC Staff, Media and others which totalled more than 500 people. The main work involved the sorting and delivery of breakfast, morning tea, and lunches to the various sections running the Championships. Other Old Boys Volunteers assisted with Workforce on the beach. The ordering of foodstuffs, including the dietary requirements was handled by the Supporters Club and we were blessed with the great working relationship between Executive Chef Jason and Ken Coulston.

We began the year with a BBQ breakfast as a lead into the Old Boys AGM and the Club AGM.

The social side began with us joining with Broadbeach Surf Club to celebrate the Lost Keg. The Lost Keg incident goes back to the mid 60's where there appears to have been a "misunderstanding" between our then President and the Broadbeach Members. This year we presented Broadbeach Members with a Survival Kit which raised much mirth with the gathering of Old Boys from each Club.

Dear Members,

It is with pleasure that I present the Financial Report and Independent Auditor's Report of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the financial year ending 30 June 2025. The 2024–25 period has been a strong year for the Club financially, underpinned by strong fiscal management, growing members support, and a focus on long-term sustainability.

Financial Overview

This year, the Club recorded a **modest operating surplus of \$636,343**, maintaining our stable financial position while continuing to invest in our people, programs, and facilities. We have balanced our commitment to volunteer lifesaving services, surf sports, and community engagement with prudent budget oversight.

Key financial highlights include:

- **Total Revenue:** \$2,781,175.76
- **Total Expenditure:** \$2,144,832.57
- **Net Surplus/Deficit:** \$636,343.19
- **Cash Reserves:** \$260,513.20 (as at 30 June 2025)

Revenue was primarily derived from:

- Rental revenue and donations
- Government grants and operational support
- Fundraising
- Membership fees
- Sponsorships and partnerships

Donations received from the Supporters Club totalled \$923,748. In addition to this the Supporters Club donated \$1,074,756 to service the building loan and costs. Loan amounts repaid by the Surf Club to the Supporters Club were \$200,000. During the financial year the building loans were reduced from \$3,228,073 (2024) to \$2,534,175 (2025).

Key Investments and Expenditure

Significant areas of expenditure this year included:

- **Lifesaving Operations:** Equipment maintenance, uniforms, and patrol resources to ensure a safe and well-supported beach environment.
- **Surf Sports Program:** Continued investment in member development, coaching support, and competition at local and national events.
- **Facilities and Equipment:** Upgrades to training equipment, training room improvements and maintenance.
- **Youth and Nipper Development:** Ongoing support for our junior programs, which continue to be a cornerstone of our community impact and the future of our club.

Strategic Financial Management

The Board of Management met regularly throughout the year to align and oversee funding allocations with our strategy and mission. We continue to apply a conservative approach to all aspects of our expenditure with the view to support all our members and all aspects of our surf sports program.

Acknowledgements

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Kurrawa SLS Supporters Association, the Board of Management, and our Operations and Administration teams for their diligence and collaboration throughout the year. I would like to personally acknowledge and thank Karen Fleischer who as always operates in the best interest of the Club. Special thanks also to our sponsors, and members whose ongoing support is critical to our success.

We thank Mr. Ian Barfoot from CAAAS for reviewing our financials and completing our audit in a timely manner to meet our AGM and annual reporting timelines.

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc. remains in a strong financial position, well placed to meet the demands of the future and continue delivering high-quality lifesaving, surf sports, and community programs in our fun, family friendly, welcoming and professional environment.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICY INFORMATION

Corporate Information

The financial report is for Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld). The association is a charity registered under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth).

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – AASB 1060: *General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities* of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB). The Charity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Charity is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

c. Economic Dependence

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

e. Revenue

Revenue and Other Income

The Charity is first required to determine whether amounts received are accounted for as Revenue per AASB 15: *Revenue from Contracts with Customers* or Income per AASB 1058: *Income of Not-for-Profit Entities*.

Funding arrangements which are enforceable and contain sufficiently specific performance obligations are recognised as revenue under AASB 15. Otherwise, such arrangements are accounted for under AASB 1058, where upon initial recognition of an asset, the Charity is required to consider whether any other financial statement elements should be recognised (e.g. financial liabilities representing repayable amounts), with any difference being recognised immediately in profit or loss as income.

Operating grants, donations and bequests

When the Charity receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the Charity:

- > identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- > recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- > recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Charity:

- > recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- > recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- > recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the Charity recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

Contributed assets

The Charity receives assets from the government and other parties for nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116, AASB 1058 and AASB 138).

On initial recognition of an asset, the Charity recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The Charity recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

Capital grant

When the Charity receives a capital grant, it recognises a liability for the excess of the initial carrying amount of the financial asset received over any related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions) recognised under other Australian Accounting Standards.

The Charity recognises income in profit or loss when or as the Charity satisfies its obligations under terms of the grant.

e. Revenue (continued)

Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Charity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and its value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in profit or loss.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Charity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the Association would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is determined as the depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued asset is identified, this is recognised against the revaluation surplus in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that class of asset.

g. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Charity.

The estimate of the useful life of plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered by the committee during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee members.

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting year are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1f for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Charity and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are classified as repairs and maintenance and are charged to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income during the financial year in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including leasehold improvements is depreciated on a straight line basis (prime rate) over their useful lives to the Charity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over either the unexpired year of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Leasehold Improvements	2.50% - 10.00%
Furniture and Fittings	3.33% - 25.00%
Gear and Equipment	5.00% - 50.00%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting year.

l. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the Charity during the reporting year that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting year. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Charity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting year.

n. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the Charity receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the Charity pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (during the year 11.5% [12.0% from 01 July 2025] of the employee's ordinary times earnings) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting year in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The Charity's obligations for short-term employee benefits are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Long-term employee benefits

The Charity only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting year in which the employees render the related service.

The Charity had no obligations for long-term employee benefits. When the Charity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting year, then the obligations are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

o. Leases

The Charity as lessee

At inception of a contract, the Charity would assess if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the Charity where the Charity is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (i.e. a lease with a remaining lease term of twelve months or less), leases of low-value assets and concessionary (peppercorn) leases are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

The Charity has no leases that could be classified as a right-of-use asset and with a corresponding lease liability.

Concessionary leases

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the Charity to further its objectives (also referred to as peppercorn leases/concessionary leases), the Charity has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2019-8 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

The Charity is dependent on this lease to further its objectives. Without this concessionary lease, it would be unlikely for the Charity to provide surf life saving services.

The Charity as lessor

The Charity leases a portion of the building to the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc.

Rental income received from the operating lease is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

p. Financial Instruments

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Charity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the Charity commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted). Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified “at fair value through profit or loss” in which case transaction costs are recognised immediately as expenses in profit or loss.

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, amortised cost using the effective interest method, or cost. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial asset is derecognised.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities other than financial guarantees are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial liability is derecognised.

Impairment

At the end of each reporting year, the Charity assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset has been impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is deemed to be impaired if, and only if, there is objective evidence that impairment as a result of one or more events (a “loss event”) has occurred, which has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset/s.

q. New and Amended Accounting Standards Adopted by the Charity

AASB 2022-6: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Non-current liabilities with covenants

The Charity adopted AASB 2022-6 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Non-current liabilities with covenants which amends AASB 101 to improve the information an entity provides in its financial statements about liabilities from loan arrangements for which the Charity’s right to defer settlement of those liabilities for twelve months after the reporting period is subject to the Charity complying with conditions specified in the loan arrangement.

The adoption of the amendment did not have a material impact on the financial statements.

AASB 2023-3: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Disclosure of Non-current Liabilities with Covenants – Tier 2

AASB 2023-3 amends AASB 1060 to align the disclosure requirements of Tier 2 entities with the Tier 1 equivalents in AASB 2020-1 and AASB 2022-6. AASB 2023-3 amends AASB 1060 to:

- a. clarify that a liability is classified as non-current if an entity has the right at the reporting date to defer settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting date;
- b. clarify the reference to settlement of a liability by the issue of equity instruments in classifying liabilities; and
- c. require the disclosure of information that enables users of the financial statements to understand the risk that non-current liabilities with covenants could become repayable within twelve months.

a. The Charity has a loan facility of up to \$8,500,000 with the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc to fund the new building and to assist in the repayment of the bank loans described above. The loan taken is non-recourse interest free loan which will be repaid as specified in the loan agreement. The loan has been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan.

b. The bank loans comprise of two loans, for \$6,000,000 and for \$2,000,000, both being principal and interest. The loan facilities expire on 27 February 2028. Accordingly, the principal and interest loans have been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan. Further, the Charity has \$302,118 available for redraw if required.

A loan covenant exists over the loans which requires the 'Debt Service Cover ratio of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc and the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc is at all times not less than 1.25 times where the Debt Service Cover = (EBITDA less tax divided by gross interest plus twelve months principal payments plus line fees). The loan covenant is reviewed on a monthly basis and no breach of the covenant has been identified during the financial year or to the date of this financial report.

If a breach of the loan covenant is evident, then the bank loans would be reclassified as current, that is, repayable within the next twelve months, by a date the bank demands.

Westpac Banking Corporation holds the following securities over the loans:

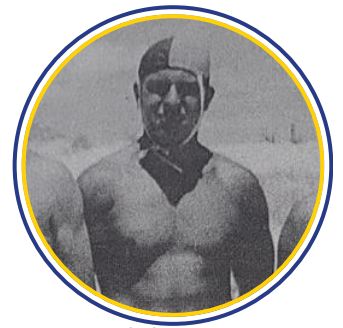

Vale - Terrence John Ross

We acknowledge the passing of Terrence Ross, one of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club's original bronze medallion holders.

Terry was Captain of the very first bronze squad (bronze number Q1625), completing his assessment alongside 11 fellow members from the Police Youth Club at Lang Park on 2 November 1958. This marked the beginning of our proud history as what was then known as Lennons Broadbeach Surf Club. Two further squads followed shortly after – one of five members on 13 December 1958 and another five on 9 March 1959.

Terry remained an active member and competitor, remembered fondly for both his service and sense of humour—particularly his unique march past technique. Outside of surf lifesaving, he was also a Queensland champion weightlifter, famously lifting 744lb 2oz.

With Terry's passing, only two members remain from these pioneering bronze squads of 22.

A funeral service for Terry was held at Sacred Heart, Paddington, on Thursday 22 August. We extend our deepest condolences to his family and friends. His legacy and contribution to Kurrawa will not be forgotten.

We acknowledge with sadness the passing of Kurrawa Life Member, Keith Bentley, who passed away on Saturday, 31st May 2025, aged 78.

Keith was awarded Life Membership in 1975, becoming the fourth Kurrawa member to receive this prestigious honour. His commitment to the Club and the Surf Life Saving movement spanned decades, beginning with his Bronze Medallion, awarded on 17th January 1965.

Keith held numerous senior leadership roles throughout the 1960s and 1970s, including:

- President (1973/1974)
- Deputy President (1967/68 and 1969/70)
- Club Captain (1966/67)
- Secretary (1966/67 to 1973/74)

He played a leading role in significant clubhouse developments, most notably the 1968 and 1982 extensions. The 1968 project included the introduction of a Ladies Lounge for the wives and partners of patrolling members—a forward-thinking initiative that was the first of its kind in a Surf Life Saving Club.

Keith's passion, vision, and tireless efforts laid the foundations for the strong and successful Club we know today. His legacy continues to be felt in the culture and community spirit that defines Kurrawa.

He will be remembered with great respect and gratitude.

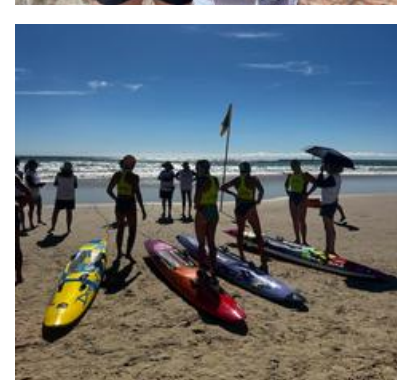
