The time has come to reflect on another patrolling season at Kurrawa Beach. A season like no other; where COVID-19 finally arrived on our doorstep at our busiest time of the year, the holiday period, a time that tests even the most patient of our patrolling members. COVID-19 hit us hard in January 2022 but you all soldiered on and helped each other out when needed. Not only did we have to deal with heavy rain, big surf and beach closures, but we also had to make sure our members were safe and taken care of as well as meeting our patrol obligations with SLSQ.

I know some weekends over the 'summer' it felt like we were swimming just to get to the beach not actually at the beach. It was most definitely the wettest summer I have experienced since moving to the Gold Coast. For the most part, you all braved the weather and showed up not only for each other but also the public and those interstate travellers that just had to swim while visiting.

Over the patrolling season our team carried out 6,788 patrol hours, 915 water safety hours and 1,844 operation support hours. Hats off to all of you that took on extra duties and hours to help our team and the wider community. This comes to a grand total of 9,511 hours which is an amazing effort. Once again, we had zero deaths between the flags at Kurrawa Beach.

Google defines a Lifesaver as person who rescues another from danger of death, especially from drowning, and/or a difficult situation or critical moment. But the truth is, we are so much more than that. We provide a safety blanket to our community for the summer months. We create a wider second family environment, either through sport or friendship, that people want to be part of.

There are very few sports that have a requirement for volunteer hours from athletes and I know at times over the summer it can feel like a chore to meet these requirements, but if we look at the whole picture there is a bigger lesson to learn - the importance of giving back to others and the community without expecting anything back in return.

A heartfelt thank you goes out to each and every one of you for your service and for keeping our beach safe, the hard yards do not go unnoticed. We all know it takes a village and that everyone has a part to play.

Enjoy the well-deserved break and I look forward to seeing you all back on the beach again this coming patrol season.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT OFFICER OLIVER VAN ECK

With the 2021/2022 season coming to a close, it was nice to get some normality back into patrols and surf club life. Being my first season undertaking this role, it was amazing to see all of the hard work that was put in to get to this point from not only the executives boards, but from all our members around the club.

Kurrawa saw a 19% increase in youth membership in the 2021/2022 season, making it the fastest growing section within the club. This really put a spotlight on creating an environment within the surf club that can help shape and mentor our youth into committed active members of Kurrawa.

During the Queensland and Northern New South Wales floods, Kurrawa took a team of youth members down to Chinderah, led by the Old Boys, to cook a feast on the BBQ and help the victims and volunteers of the floods. This would not have been possible if it wasn't for all of the members donations of food and household necessities, so a huge thank you to those who donated items.

Kurrawa also took a group to the Youth Ball run by South Coast and Point Danger Branches for the first time in some years. Run at the end of May, the night invited youth members from all Gold Coast clubs to come together to dress up and build stronger interclub relationships, as well as get some ideas for new and exciting concepts that other clubs have begun to implement. The night was filled with fun and laughs and was great to be able to show off the high quality members that Kurrawa has to offer.

Moving forward, Kurrawa plans on taking 25 of our youth members to a three day team building camp on the Sunshine Coast in July. Ideally, turning into an annual event, I believe that having a camp that is more focused on leadership, teamwork and resilience, rather than just a training camp, opens the opportunity for members from all sections to come together and learn skills that will help the culture of Kurrawa thrive as these members eventually move on from the youth program.

Finally, moving forward into the next seasons, I hope to further increase the retention of our youth members through providing opportunities to grow and learn skills that these members will utilise for the rest of their lives, not only within the surf club. Through the implementation of more events, internal opportunities, and an updated reward scheme, I am very excited to see what the 2022/2023 season brings us.





FIRST AID OFFICER CHERYL MACDONALD

Another busy season for Kurrawa on our beach and the introduction of first aid as part of our bronze course has seen our club experience a valuable increase in first aid awards amongst our patrol groups. A grant through the Beach Safety Equipment funding allowed us to purchase a new soft pack for the patrol Oxy-Viva which is more user friendly than the old stainless steel cradle.

Hopefully over the next few seasons we will be able to phase the old oxy-viva's out and replace them with the newer bag type resus kits. Changes incorporating calling for QAS if a patient has been placed on oxygen therapy along with the use of finger pulse meters has seen a decrease in the use of oxygen in the past season.

We have built a good working relationship with Alpha First Aid and this has paved the way for them to donate a family of Little Annie training manikins to Kurrawa and another set to South Coast Branch.

A couple of tips to take on board which will assist with the operations of our first aid room:

- First Aid items used should be noted on the white board in the first aid room to enable it to be replaced, this includes members/competitors taking bandages, tape etc. when competing in carnivals.
- AED defibrillators do not require testing by removing the battery, this equipment constantly performs self-checks. The defib will beep if it has a problem. Removing and reinserting the battery causes the equipment to reboot and this action uses almost the equivalent power of a shock. We recently replaced two batteries at \$250.00 each that were not due to expire until 2024.
- Only members holding the ART award can check the oxygen equipment and this task should be allocated by the PC to avoid unnecessary checks of the oxygen bottle contents. Items stored in the resus kits that are sealed in bags should remain that way until required in an emergency, please do not break open sealed bags to check the contents as this will render that equipment unusable.

Enjoy the break and I look forward to seeing everyone again in September.



OLD BOYS COMMITTEE JEFF BIGNELL

The Objectives of the Old Boys Committee is to assist the Club in the promotion of Lifesaving activities, unite Club Members involved in Old Boys activities in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship, and mutual understanding, and provide a social forum for those wishing to be involved in Old Boys Activities. We have been able to meet these objectives through many projects and activities conducted throughout the year.

The Old boys again ran the Bugs and Bees Golf Day at Boomerang Farm Golf Club and some \$2000 was raised. We received a good response from supporters and volunteers on the day.

In August and September for a period of six weeks we hosted the South Sydney Rabbitohs recovery sessions where we catered for their breakfast. We received \$1200 from the Rabbitohs for our work, and we incurred costs of approximately \$100.

It is with pleasure that I present the Audited Financial Report of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the financial year ended 31 March 2022.

The financial report for the 2021/2022 year records an operating Surplus of 1,535,586. In comparison to an operating deficit of \$247,943 for the previous year which was severely impacted by COVID-19 operating restrictions. There were still restrictions and COVID-19 operating uncertainty causing reduced related travel and trade however, the surf club and the supporters club adapted and continued to operate and service our members and the community.

The donations received from Kurrawa SLS Supporter's Association Inc. allowed the surf club to focus on our published mission;

To be Australia's premier Surf Life Saving Club, servicing the community through a safe beach. With exceptional training and education programs from youth to elite in a fun, family friendly, welcoming and professional environment.

Donations received from the Supporters Club totaled \$550,000. In addition to this the Supporters Club donated \$1,259,161 to service the building loan and costs. Loan amounts repaid by the Club to the Supporters Club were \$900,000. During the financial year the building loans were reduced from \$5,555,308 (2021) to \$4,601,774 (2022).

Total available cash at 31 March was \$50,342.

As always, I would like to thank the Supporters Club Committee and staff for their hard work without which we would not afford the financial backing to operate the surf lifesaving club as we do today.

I would also like to thank all of our professional office staff whose support to the Board and Members has allowed a smooth operation and focus on our mission and strategy. In particular, I thank Karen Fleischer whose support and professionalism has greatly supported my role as Treasurer and always operates in the best interest of the club and our bottom line. Thank you again Karen for your great service!

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial report is for Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld). The association is a charity registered under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth).

Basis of Preparation

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc applies Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards and AASB 2010–2: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements and other applicable Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB), the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld), the *Collections Act 1966* (Qld) and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth). The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

c. Economic Dependence

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

e. Revenue

Revenue recognition

Contributed assets

The association receives assets from the government and other parties for nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116, AASB 1058 and AASB 138).

On initial recognition of an asset, the association recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The association recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

Capital grant

Grant revenue received from government that relates to the purchase of capital assets is offset against the amount of the capital asset. The grant is recognised in profit or loss over the life of the depreciable asset as a reduced depreciation expense.

Operating grants, donations and bequests

When the association receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the association:

- > identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- > recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- > recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the association:

- > recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- > recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- > recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the association recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

The estimate of the useful life of plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered by the committee during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee members.

g. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The committee members found no indication that any asset had been impaired.

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1g for details of impairment).

k. Property, Plant and Equipment (continued)

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are classified as repairs and maintenance and are charged to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including leasehold improvements is depreciated on a straight line basis (prime rate) over their useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Furniture and Fittings	3.33% - 25.00%
Gear and Equipment	5.00% - 50.00%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

l. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the association receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the association pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 10.0% [10.5% from 01 July 2022] of the employee's average ordinary salary) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The association's obligations for short-term employee benefits are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

m. Employee Benefits (continued)

Long-term employee benefits

The association only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the association's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The association's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as provisions under non-current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position, except where the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

n. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

o. Leases

The association as lessee

At inception of a contract, the association would assess if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the association where the association is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (i.e. a lease with a remaining lease term of twelve months or less), leases of low-value assets and concessionary (peppercorn) leases are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Concessionary leases

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the association to further its objectives (also referred to as peppercorn leases), the association has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2018-8 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

The association is dependent on this lease to further its objectives. Without this concessionary lease, it would be unlikely for the association to provide surf life saving services.

The association as lessor

The association leases a portion of the building to the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc.

Rental income received from the operating lease is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

p. Financial Instruments

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the association becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the association commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted). Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss" in which case transaction costs are recognised immediately as expenses in profit or loss.

p. Financial Instruments (continued)

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, amortised cost using the effective interest method, or cost. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial asset is derecognised.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities other than financial guarantees are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial liability is derecognised.

Impairment

At the end of each reporting period, the association assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset has been impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is deemed to be impaired if, and only if, there is objective evidence that impairment as a result of one or more events (a "loss event") has occurred, which has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset(s).

a. The association has a loan facility of up to \$8,500,000 with the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc to fund the new building and to assist in the repayment of the bank loans described above. The loan taken is non-recourse interest free loan which will be repaid as specified in the loan agreement. The loan has been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan.

b. The bank loans comprise of two loans, for \$6,000,000 and for \$2,000,000, both being principal and interest. The loan facilities expire on 27 February 2028. Accordingly, the principal and interest loans have been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan. Further, the association has \$1,002,062 available for redraw if required.

A loan covenant exists over the loans which requires the 'Debt Service Cover ratio of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc and the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc is at all times not less than 1.25 times where the Debt Service Cover = (EBITDA less tax divided by gross interest plus twelve months principal payments plus line fees). The loan covenant is reviewed on a monthly basis and no breach of the covenant has been identified during the financial year or to the date of this financial report.

Westpac Banking Corporation holds the following securities over the loans:

- > Mortgage over lease held by the association;
- > Supported debt and interest held by Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc;
- > Mortgage over lease held by Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc; and

Richard Barton, known to many as Rick joined Kurrawa Surf Club in 1966 as a 16-year-old.

As a junior member he carried out club duties, ie cleaning, fund raising and maintenance as well as completing patrols on Kurrawa Beach.

In the 1970's, Rick stepped up to take on positions within the club viz: Assistant Secretary, Boat Captain, First Aid Officer and Branch delegate. This era saw the emergence of a young man destined to become an ardent and long-time worker for lifesaving in general and Kurrawa Surf Club in particular.

For three years Rick was Assistant Secretary, he then moved into the position of Treasurer and from there became Club President, a position he held for years. During his presidency the 1984 Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships were held on Kurrawa beach – heralded as one as the most successful events.

Hosting the Championships required a workforce of 200 volunteers on Friday, 400 Saturday and 400 Sunday – a mammoth task! The event benefited the whole Gold Coast community, restaurants, hotels, accommodation houses and entertainment parks and centers.

On 20th June 1992 Rick was elected as a Life Member of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club – at this time he had held committee positions for 17 years.

Moving into the 1990's Rick remained an office bearer of the club and in 1993 Kurrawa again put their hand up to host the Australian Championships and appointed Rick as the chairman of the Local Organizing Committee – these championships continued on Kurrawa beach for 10 years from 1996-2005.

During this time, with Council approval, renovations were taking place on the clubhouse and in nine days Kurrawa hosted four major carnivals under Rick's regime and created 'The Greatest Show on Surf' ever seen in Australia

and chairman Rick Barton and his committee were proud to have chosen to be part of this historic time.

Rick was also Director at Surf Life Saving Queensland for a period of two years.

In 1996 Kurrawa opened the doors to their new 'Kurrawa Supporters Club' – this was a commercial venture to raise much needed funds for the surf club. Rick instantly became interested and joined the committee – everyone on the committee was a volunteer – he was quickly appointed as the Treasurer, a position he held until his recent passing. During his time as the Treasurer, he has been instrumental on the building committee that organized the new premises the club is now in.

Rick's prowess as a Treasurer has meant Kurrawa Surf Club was able to pull down their old club and build a beautiful one next door. Rick's management of the Supporter's club funds has assisted the Surf Club in becoming one of the most successful clubs in Queensland, as well as one of the most prestigious Supporters Clubs in Queensland.
