In November, 2011, Greg McNamara, a US born big wave surfer, surfed his way into the Guiness Book of Records atop of a 23.8m monster wave at Nazare, Portugal.

McNamara is quoted as saying 'the best training for surfing is surfing and getting pounded'. Surf Lifesaving is no different. The best training for Lifesaving is Lifesaving and getting challenged.

Surf Lifesaving at Kurrawa has seen a huge paradigm shift in how we practice the skill of Surf Lifesaving.

We stretch ourselves by increasing our foundation knowledge through a well developed internal training program, we then apply that knowledge on the beach and in our daily lives.

We train hard and compete equally as hard, understanding how to read and respect the surf and, all the while, applying this knowledge on the beach and on patrol.

During the 2019/20 season, with visitation numbers in the order of 41,500, the Kurrawa Lifesaving community was represented by 229 active patrolling members. Just shy of 22% of these patrolling members were SRCs, aged 13-15, representing the future of our Lifesaving family.

One aim of the 3 year strategic plan was to push out to 15 patrol teams in season 19/20. This aim was realised with an average of 12 members on each team.

Capably supporting these patrol teams were 11 Midday patrols with an average of 4 members in each Midday patrol team. The 229 Patrolling members monitored around 16,000 swimmers and carried out a total of 7,858 patrolling hours across the season, with most of the hours patrolled before April.

Kurrawa beach had over 4,360 Preventative Actions, with 471 minor first aid events and 18 rescues across tube, board and IRB during the 2019/20 season.

None of this would have been possible without the dedication of the Board of Lifesaving and the Kurrawa Leadership Team who I would like to thank.

The foundations of the Lifesaving community have been reinforced over the last few years and the passion and dedication in Junior and Senior Competitors and non-Competitors is returning which would indicate that Kurrawa Surf Lifesaving is heading into a golden period.



This certainly helps with training and competing at carnivals.

Numbers through the year grew with Boot camps averaging over 50 nippers on any given day. Again, great numbers with water safety on these days showing the professionalism and Kurrawa brand at its best. A big thank you to Nick and Paul for their planning and organisation on these days. The camps have grown over the last 5 years to a highlight of the season. Great memories for all Nippers rubbing shoulders with the Club's elite during these camps and question time with nippers asking their idols questions. Thank you to all involved and senior elite athletes for your time.

In mentioning our coaches, I would like to thank Paul Wotherspoon for his efforts this season in leading the Junior Activities team. His planning and commitment this year has been something to watch. He had our athletes primed for States and it was certainly a shame when the season was cancelled. The skill set on our athletes especially body surfing leading to Branch was unbelievable to see. I would also like to acknowledge Bonnie Hancock our assistant coach. Bonnie took the reins of the 8's to 10's and guided them with a calming experienced influence. Thanks so much Bonnie. We were also fortunate again this season to have Mel Cracroft-Wilson as beach coach for the juniors. With her workload with both Nippers & seniors to program, she facilitated our program's to perfection. What a great sight it was at Pizzy Park on any given Monday afternoon.

As usual our nipper program does not run without our nipper committee and age managers. We are so fortunate that each year we can bring together a group of parents and friends who can work together to achieve the common goal of ensuring a fun and family friendly nipper program. As always it has been an awesome and fun group to work with. To my deputy Adam Pine, a big thank you for all your support throughout the year.

To the Board of Management who are officially the Nippers major sponsor. The Nipper community is certainly grateful for your support. The structure in which you instil from Coaching, supplying of boards, training and the facilities helps provides a fantastic competitive and fun program. Thank you. To our administration staff headed by Katie Kiddie and assisted by Brielle Cooper a big thanks for your efforts.

Nick Crilly the clubs head of Surf Sports deserves special praise, Nick has to co-ordinate the whole club program from senior athletes and coaches down to Nipper levels. From what I have witnessed this year as Chairman, I have a new understanding of how big and thankless a job at times this can be. On Nipper carnival days Nick could be found on the water's edge with the 14's 15's age group giving advice to those nippers competing. Thank you, Nick, for your support this year.

Interesting stats for the year;

- Number of nipper Sundays held 16 with only 4 cancelled due to conditions or restrictions.
- 20 BBQ's hosted over the season including Carols and carnivals. Approximately 4,000 sausages cooked, 1300 eggs and 2,800 burgers cooked this season.
- 500 foamies loaded on and off the trailer and taken down to the beach for nipper Sunday's
- 96 tents put up and packed down for Nipper Sundays and another 60 at carnivals.
- 16 Saturday Iron sessions and more than 100 scheduled sessions and boot camps.

These statistics speak for themselves and a big thank you to the Kurrawa Nipper workforce. To Vanessa, Katrina, Jess, Sasha and Gavin a special thank you for your efforts throughout the season with organising and cooking on the BBQ.

To all who helped at times through the year thank you. Those stats are unbelievable. I would like to take this time to say thanks and please stay healthy and safe at present.

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Your committee members present this financial report on the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc for the financial year ended 31 March 2020.

The committee members have been in office since the start of the financial year to the date of this report unless otherwise stated.

Principal Activities

The principal activities of the association during the financial year were to promote, advance and control the work of surf life saving, the resuscitation of the apparently drowned, the treatment and resuscitation of any person stung by any marine stinger, and the application of First Aid on surfing beaches and elsewhere.

Significant Changes

There was no significant change in the nature of these activities during the year.

There are no significant changes in the Clubs activities subject to the acknowledgement that in December 2019 cases involving a new coronavirus, now known as CoVid-19, were reported in Wuhan, China. The infection has subsequently spread to a number of countries around the world, including Australia. The World Health Organization (WHO) on 11 March 2020 declared CoVid-19 a pandemic. At the time of preparing this Committee report the Committee noted the following relevant matters:

- (i) There have been ongoing announcements of travel restrictions, area lockdowns, and other restrictions across the community which have targeted certain industries (e.g. restaurants, cafes, clubs and other public places);
- (ii) The Federal Government has introduced a series of measures estimated to cost \$320 billion in order to limit the impact of CoVid-19 on the economy. State Government and Councils have also implemented measures to reduce any economic impacts. One measure provides employers with a wage subsidy designed to ensure that employees continue to be employed;
- (iii) The extent of the severity of the effect of CoVid-19 on the Australian economy and the Club is currently uncertain; and
- (iv) The period of time for which the CoVid-19 will affect the economy and the Club is uncertain.

Having regard to the above and in lieu of an ability to ascertain the individual impact on the Club's activities the Committee has not attempted to make any allowance for CoVid-19 otherwise then that at Note 22 of this Financial Report.

COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Operating Result

The deficit amounted to \$10,049 (2019: deficit of \$61,858). The association is exempt from income tax (refer Note 1a).

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial report is for Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld). The association is a charity registered under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth).

Basis of Preparation

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc applies Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards and AASB 2010–2: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements and other applicable Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards — Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB), the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld), the Collections Act 1966 (Qld) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth). The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Contributions

If and when Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government or other parties for nothing or a nominal value the contributions would be recognised at the fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the Statement of Financial Position and revenue in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

c. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST receivable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

d. Economic Dependence

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet it's financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

e. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

f. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

The estimate of the useful life of plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered by the committee during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee members.

g. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

h. Revenue

Revenue recognition

The association has applied AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers (AASB 15) and AASB 1058: Income of Not-for-Profit Entities (AASB 1058) using the cumulative effective method of initially applying AASB 15 and AASB 1058 as an adjustment to the opening balance of equity on 01 January 2019. Therefore, the comparative information has not been restated and continues to be presented under AASB 118: Revenue and AASB 1004: Contributions. The details of accounting policies under AASB 118 and AASB 1004 are disclosed separately since they are different from those under AASB 15 and AASB 1058, and the impact of those changes is disclosed in Note 1.

In the current year

Operating grants, donations and bequests

When the association receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

When both these conditions are satisfied, the company:

- > identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- > recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- > recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the company:

- > recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- > recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- > recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the association recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

Capital grant

Grant revenue received from government that relates to the purchase of capital assets is offset against the amount of the capital asset. The grant is recognised in profit or loss over the life of the depreciable asset as a reduced depreciation expense.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

In the comparative period

Non-reciprocal grant revenue was recognised in profit or loss when the association obtained control of the grant and it was probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant would flow to the association and the amount of the grant could be measured reliably.

If conditions were attached to the grant which must be satisfied before the association was eligible to receive the contribution, the recognition of the grant as revenue was deferred until those conditions were satisfied.

When grant revenue was received whereby the association incurred an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this was considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue was recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service had been delivered to the contributor; otherwise, the grant was recognised as income on receipt.

Donations and bequests were recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue was recognised using the effective interest method.

Revenue from the rendering of a service was recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customer.

All revenue was stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

i. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less.

j. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

k. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

I. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1(g) for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are classified as repairs and maintenance and are charged to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including leasehold improvements is depreciated on a straight line basis (prime rate) over their useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

m. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the association receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the association pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 9.5% of the employee's average ordinary salary) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The association's obligations for short-term employee benefits are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Long-term employee benefits

The association only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the association's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The association's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as provisions under non-current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position, except where the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

n. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

o. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

p. Leases

The association as lessee

At inception of a contract, the association would assess if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the association where the association is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (i.e. a lease with a remaining lease term of twelve months or less), leases of low-value assets and 'peppercorn leases' are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Concessionary leases

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the association to further its objectives (commonly known as peppercorn/concessionary leases), the association has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2018-8 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

The association is dependent on this lease to further its objectives. Without this concessionary lease, it would be unlikely for the association to provide surf life saving services.

The association as lessor

The association leases a portion of the building to the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc.

Rental income received from operating leases is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the specific lease.

q. Financial Instruments

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the association becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the association commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted). Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss" in which case transaction costs are recognised immediately as expenses in profit or loss.

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, amortised cost using the effective interest method, or cost. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial asset is derecognised.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities other than financial guarantees are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial liability is derecognised.

Impairment

At the end of each reporting period, the association assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset has been impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is deemed to be impaired if, and only if, there is objective evidence that impairment as a result of one or more events (a "loss event") has occurred, which has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset(s).

r. New and Amended Accounting Policies Adopted by the Company

The association has implemented three new Accounting Standards that are applicable for the current reporting period and have come into effect, which are included in the results. AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers, AASB 1058: Income of Not-for-Profit Entities and AASB 16: Leases have been applied using the cumulative effective method; that is, by recognising the cumulative effect of initially applying AASB 15, AASB 1058 and AASB 16 as an adjustment to the opening balance of equity at 01 January 2019. Therefore, the comparative information has not been restated and continues to be reported under AASB 118: Revenue, AASB 117: Leases and AASB 1004: Contributions. Further information is provided below.

The association has applied AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers and AASB 1058: Income of Not-for-Profit Entities using the cumulative effective method of initially applying AASB 15 and AASB 1058 as an adjustment to the opening balance of equity at 01 January 2019. Therefore, the comparative information has not been restated and continues to be presented under AASB 118: Revenue and AASB 1004: Contributions.

The association has elected to apply AASB 1058 retrospectively only to contracts that are not completed contracts at the date of initial application of which there were nil.

Initial application of AASB 16

The following practical expedients were considered and where applicable adopted by the association in applying AASB 16 for the first time:

- > leases that are classified as a 'peppercorn lease' were recognised under the temporary relief for peppercorn leases in AASB 2018-8;
- > leases that have a remaining lease term of less than twelve months as at 01 January 2019 have been accounted for in the same way as short-term leases, refer to Note 1p;
- > the use of hindsight to determine lease terms on contracts that have options to extend or terminate;
- > applying AASB 16 to leases previously identified as leases under AASB 117 and Interpretation 4: *Determining whether an arrangement contains a lease* without reassessing whether they are, or contain, a lease at the date of initial application; and
- > not applying AASB 16 to leases previously not identified as containing a lease under AASB 117 and Interpretation 4.

- a. The association has a loan facility of up to \$8,500,000 with the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc to fund the new building and to assist in the repayment of the bank loans described above. The loan taken is non-recourse interest free loan which will be repaid as specified in the loan agreement. The loan has been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan.
- b. The bank loans comprise of two loans, for \$6,000,000 and for \$2,000,000, both being principal and interest. The loan facilities expire on 27 February 2028. Accordingly, the principal and interest loans have been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan. Further, the association has \$599,400 available for redraw if required and this amount was redrawn on 01 April 2020. The withdrawn funds were used to repay the current loan from the related party of \$500,000 and the balance was retained in the association's bank account to be used for operational purposes during the government imposed restricted trading period.

A loan covenant exists over the loans which requires the 'Debt Service Cover ratio of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc and the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc is at all times not less than 1.25 times where the Debt Service Cover = (EBITDA less tax divided by gross interest plus twelve months principal payments plus line fees). The loan covenant is reviewed on a monthly basis and no breach of the covenant has been identified during the financial year or to the date of this financial report.

NOTE 22: GOING CONCERN

Current asset ratio

The financial report has been prepared on the going concern basis of accounting. The Current Asset Ratio (current assets: current liabilities) was 0.17 to 1.00 as at 31 March 2020 (2019; 0.34 to 1.00). This is due to the construction of the new club which has been financed and a portion of the loan has been disclosed as a current liability.

There is a 'donations agreement' in place and details are disclosed in Note 6. Further, an amount of approximately \$600,000 is available for redraw if required for operational purposes, refer Note 11a and 11b.

The ability of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc to realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities in the normal course of business and at the amounts stated in the financial report is contingent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Club Inc providing sufficient funds to cover operational, investing and financing requirements.

Global pandemic - Covid-19

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc has properly considered and allowed for the impact of the COVID-19 global pandemic and the resulting State and Commonwealth Government COVID-19 mitigation strategies. In the context of the COVID-19 global pandemic and the State and Commonwealth Government COVID-19 mitigation restrictions the association's financial results for the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 were anticipated and commensurate with the association's trading in the period 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019.

The association maintains cashflow projections for the association's financial year ended 31 March 2020. The association's cash flow projections for the association's financial year ended 31 March 2020 account for both a significant decrease in the association's operational and capital expenditure and the Commonwealth, State and Local fiscal incentives. The association is of the view these cash flow projections are an accurate and reliable representation of the association's cash flow for the financial years ended 31 March 2021.

At the date of this financial report, the committee of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc believes the association will be able to pay all of its debts as and when they become due and payable.
